## Thrasher Family Reunion

The Thrasher Family Association returns to Virginia May 4-6 for the 2018 TFA Reunion. The Holiday Inn & Suites Gateway in Williamsburg will be our headquarters for this year's reunion. The cutoff date for the special group rates (Thrasher Family Reunion) is midnight on April 4, 2018. Note: There is a two-day minimum on all reservations. Please contact the Holiday Inn & Suites at 757-229-9990 to make your reservation. A meeting room is being provided by the hotel (James Room) which will serve as Reunion Central during the weekend.

On Friday evening, May 4, we are planning an outing to Historic Williamsburg for dinner. We will meet in the hotel lobby at 5:30 PM and car pool to the restaurant. ### ***A Changing Wind: Commerce and Conflict in Civil War Atlanta***

*A Changing Wind: Commerce and Conflict In Civil War Atlanta* explains how Atlanta grew from a transportation center into a major industrial, commercial and medical center during the war and how different levels of its society were affected. The author is a professor of history at Georgia State University. Atlanta’s businessmen, both Confederate and Unionist, some who opposed secession, cast their lot with the Confederacy and their gamble paid off in profits during the first two years of the war. After the war they gambled on Atlanta’s economic recovery and starting from scratch they built the New Atlanta. Others were not so lucky. Wives of soldiers had to provide for their families with little income and no help from their husbands at war.

This review centers upon Thrasher’s that appear in the book: S. S. Thrasher, J. J. Thrasher and John S. Thrasher. Of course, J. J. Thrasher is John J. Thrasher better known as “Cousin John.”

The prologue tells of a slave named Bill who was the last slave buried in Oakland Cemetery's Slave Square. Cemetery records tell us that he was owned by S. S. Thrasher and that he died at the age of forty-one on June 19, 1864. I have researched the census records for 1860 and cannot find a S. S. Thrasher in Georgia much less in Fulton County. I also researched the slave census records for 1860 and did not find S. S. Thrasher. When the Oakland Cemetery handwritten records were read, it is quite possible that J. J. Thrasher looked like S. S. Thrasher. I have experienced this in my research of deeds finding that "J" looked like an "S." In fact, J. J. Thrasher is used about as much as John J. Thrasher on deeds.

Although J. J. Thrasher is not mentioned, Dr. John G. Westmoreland, who arrived in Atlanta in 1853 founded the Atlanta Medical College in 1854. Dr. Willis Westmoreland followed his brother and became Professor of Surgery. In the 1860 census W. F. Westmoreland, age 33, Professor Surgery, is listed with the J. J. Thrasher household along with his wife, Maria Westmoreland, age 19.

On page 66 J. J. Thrasher is said to have made cartridge boxes, cartridge belts, bayonet scabbards, and shoulder straps.

After the war, the Reconstruction Acts imposed military rule on the South and decreed that states would not be readmitted to the Union unless they gave voting rights to black men. On March 4, 1867, after the passage of the first Reconstruction Act, a group of Atlantans met to discuss the "political troubles which now agitate the country." In a second meeting on April 20 other local luminaries, including J. J. Thrasher, were joined by prewar Unionists to endorse cooperation and reconciliation and appeal to Atlanta's citizenry to move beyond "our present unsettled and paralyzed conditions." This unity shows how former Confederates and former Unionist cooperated to support a common business-based vision for the city's future.

Atlanta was the news gathering center of the lower South. In the fall of 1862, western journalists formed the Press Association of the Confederate States of America and hired John S. Thrasher as its superintendent. Thrasher was formerly a correspondent for the *New York Herald*. Atlanta was selected as headquarters as it was the obvious choice because of the city's central geographic position. I could not identify this John S. Thrasher. The only John S. Thrasher in the 1860 census for the country was J. J. Thrasher's thirteen-year-old son. The 1860 census lists fifty-two John (no middle initial) Thrashers in the country. Because he was correspondent for the *New York Herald* means he could have lived any place in the country prior to the war. Who is this mysterious John S. Thrasher?

This book is a good read for someone interested in the history of Atlanta during the war.

## Bishop Family Stories

Linda Bishop of the Oconee County, Georgia, Bishop family has been kind enough to let us reprint a charming family history she has inherited through the Bishops. Written by Reverend Irwin L. Bishop in 1971, it represents his memories of the stories his mother told him about her family. His mother, Mattie Asenath Thrasher (1858-1925), married Albinus Bishop in 1876 and lived almost her entire life in Oconee County. Her parents were Barton Cloud Thrasher and Mary Celestia Bird Elder. Among her five siblings were Judge B.E. Thrasher, Frances Pamela (Thrasher) Baxter, and Ola (Thrasher) Jackson.

Our ancestress, Mattie Asenath (Thrasher) Bishop was born in Oconee County near Bishop, Georgia, July 24, 1858 and died, May 17, 1925. She was married to Albinus Bishop of Greene County, July 24. 1876. His record: Born: November 7, 1849. Died: August 17, 1936

They were third cousins through the Hester sisters. Her parents were Mary Celestia Bird Elder and Barton Cloud Thrasher.

They lived in a very substantial house. Once the stage-coach had a stop at this house, it's reported. It stands today, 1971, on the old Thrasher plantation, and it has withstood Indian attacks.

Mattie and some of her sisters were taught to sew, weave and make candles and did other chores around the house. She told us of her many experiences. She remembers when the Union soldiers came by on the march to the sea; the girls put on all their best dresses so they could hardly be seated in their little rocking chairs. This amused the soldiers very much.

Her father had the care of four of his deceased brother's children, two boys and two girls. He was the local Methodist Preacher. He and his wife died from typhoid fever. She and her cousin, Florence Thrasher, later Mrs. Wise, often disagreed. One time they were down in the pasture; the discussion was who would dare to ride the milk cow. Mattie was elected first. The results: the cow threw her over its head and ran down the hill with her skirts caught in its horns. The whole experiment was quite painful before it ended.

Mattie recalls the nasty trick of a Union soldier. He threw a grain of corn on a hook and line out to the finest turkey gobbler, which swallowed it. Then as he dragged it away, he said, "Stop following me, to be killed and cooked."

When a soldier demanded cooked food. Her mother said, "There's plenty of watermelon out there under a tree – help yourself. They replied, "Watermelons don't stop hunger." Mattie thought that was funny. She always saw humor in everything.

Most all her brothers and sisters went to college, Emory, Georgia University and a Church school in Madison – now non-existent. Mattie stayed at the Glenville parsonage with her elder sister and attended high school.

In her youth Mattie lead the singing at Ray's Methodist Church where her father was a steward for many years. She had a marvelous voice and high sense of music.

She was married July 24, 1876 after her 18<sup>th</sup> birthday on July 17. The first year she and her husband lived in Morgan County with her husband's Uncle Brice Bishop. Of the nine children born to this couple, only six reached adulthood. Both parents were very anxious that their children receive the best education they would take. She said she was not worried about leaving them any wealth – only education. Her husband was a good producer and had considerable land property. Even rated by Dunn & Bradstreet at one time.

She delighted her children and grandchildren with stories from the Bible, Mother Goose rhymes and Aesop's fables. On Sunday afternoon the boys from town would gather around on the door steps to listen. She taught the primary class for years at the Watkinsville Church Sunday School.

She, on her side, was descended from a fine line of people: The Elders, Tigners, Halls and Williams, Thrashers, Hesters, Bartons, Matthews, Rittenhouses and others. Polly Reed was descendant of George Reed from England. George Washington and the Lees of Virginia also were from his family.

This is only some of the line of Mattie Asenath Thrasher and does not take in any Bishop line except the Hester line. She had five sons, one daughter, twelve grandsons, two granddaughters, and many great grandchildren and now great-great grandchildren.

NOTE: This is to give to the best of my knowledge a few stories of Mattie T. Bishop as known by the writer, her son.
